Notes:

- 1 The above audited financial results have been reviewed by the Audit Committee and approved by the Board of Directors of Chaitanya Fin Credit Private Limited ("the Company") at their meetings held on 17 June 2021 and 18 June 2021 respectively.
- 2 The audited financial results of the Company have been prepared in accordance with Indian Accounting Standards ("IndAS") notified under Section 153 of the Companies Act 2013 ("the Act") read with the Companies (Indian Accounting Standard) Rules, 2015 as amended by the Companies Indian Accounting standards (Amendment) Rules, 2016.
- 3 The above financial results have been audited by the statutory auditors of the Company as required under Regulation 52 of the SEBI Listing Obligations and Disclosure Requirements Regulations 2015 and ("Listing Regulations") and have issued an unmodified opinion.
- 4 The figures for the half-year ended 31 March 2021 and 31 March 2020 are the balancing figures between the audited figures in respect of full financial year ended 31 March 2021 and 31 March 2020 respectively and the published half-year ended 30 September 2020 and 30 September 2019 respectively, which were subject to limited review by the statutory auditors.
- 5 On 11 May 2020, 11,400 Compulsorily Convertible Debentures of ₹ 100,000 each have been converted to 28,500,000 equity shares of ₹ 40 per share (face value of ₹10 per share) at a ratio of 1:2,500.
- 6 Consequent to the outbreak of the COVID-19 pandemic, its impact, including changes in customer behaviour and pandemic fears, as well as restriction of business and individual activities, had led to significant volatility in global and Indian financial markets and a significant decrease in global and local economic activities. The extent to which COVID-19 pandemic, including the current "second wave" that has significantly increased the number of cases in India, will continue to impact the Company's performance and will depend on ongoing as well as future developments which are highly uncertain. The Company's capital and liquidity position remains sufficient and would continue to be the focus area for the Company, accordingly, the Company does not expect a stress on its liquidity situation in the immediate future.

The Company has put in place specific measures to handle COVID-19 pandemic in line with regulatory requirements such as, social distancing (including work from home options), providing PPE (personal protective gear) to its employees in the organization. The COVID specific SOP (standard operating procedure) prepared was communicated to all the employees and, the requirement of stricter adherence has been enforced with the employees. Further, a QRT (quick response team) has been formed, to handle any exigencies reported in the organization.

The Company has recognized provisions as on 31 March 2021, towards its loan assets to the extent of ₹ 6,669.39 lakhs which includes an additional provision of ₹ 1,522.80 lakhs for impact of COVID-19 second wave, based on the information available at this point of time including economic forecasts, in accordance with the expected credit loss method. The Company believes that it has considered all the possible impact of the known events arising out of COVID-19 pandemic in the preparation of financial results.
- 7 The Hon'ble Supreme Court of India through an interim order dated 3 September 2020 (Public Interest Litigation (PIL)), had directed that accounts which were not declared non-performing assets (NPA) till 31 August 2020 shall not be declared as NPA till further orders. Basis the said interim order, the Company had not classified any account as non-performing assets (NPA), as per the Reserve Bank of India (RBI) or other regulatory prescribed norms, after 31 August 2020 which was not NPA as of 31 August 2020. The interim order granted to not declare accounts as NPA stood vacated on 23 March 2021. In accordance with the instructions in paragraph 5 of the RBI circular dated 07 April 2021 issued in this regards, the Company has complied with the asset classification of borrower accounts as per extant RBI instructions/IRAC norms.
- 8 The Company is primarily engaged in the business of financing and as such no separate information is required to be furnished in terms of Ind AS 108 "Operating segments" specified under section 133 of the Companies Act, 2013.
- 9 Figures of the previous periods have been regrouped, wherever necessary, to make them comparable with the current period.

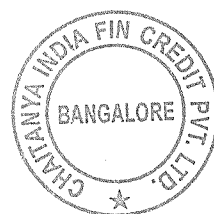

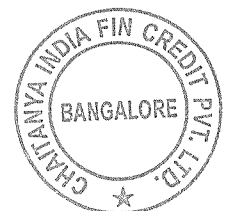

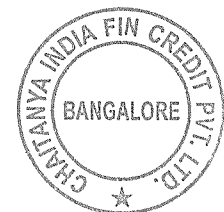

Opinion

1. Our opinion is not modified in respect of this matter.

This responsibility also includes maintenance of adequate accounting records in accordance with the provisions of the Act for safeguarding of the assets of the Company and for preventing and detecting frauds and other irregularities; selection and application of appropriate accounting policies; making judgments and estimates that are reasonable and prudent; and design, implementation and maintenance of adequate internal financial controls that were operating effectively for ensuring the accuracy and completeness of the accounting records, relevant to the preparation and presentation of the Statement that gives a true and fair view and is free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.
6. 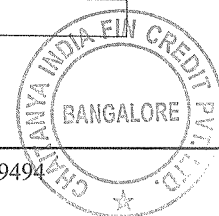
